African American Clergy Collective

Faith-based organizations are collaborating to inform Tennesseans about the impact of the **social determinants of health (SDOH)**. The SDOH are the non-medical factors that affect health outcomes. These non-medical factors include all the conditions in which Tennesseans are born, grow, work, live, worship and age. The collaboration is a multiple-month campaign led by the **African American Clergy Collective of Tennessee**, launched August 6, 2024 via a virtual convening.

The African American Clergy Collective of Tennessee (ACCT) is organizing African American Clergy and clergy organizations across Tennessee to harness the power of the Black Church to influence decision-makers for the benefit of Black Tennesseans. The alliance of multi-denominational African American clergy uses its collective power to center the needs of marginalized Black Tennesseans and advocate in the interest of four issues, Criminal Justice Reform/Policing, Education, Healthcare, and Civic Engagement. As a result, ACCT creates conditions for once silenced voices to assess policies and social institutions regarding their impact on the poor.

Thank you for joining us in these multiple-month campaign to raise awareness, inform, share and build community aimed at amplifying a message of collective impact. Organizations addressing, health, education, civil rights, economic mobility, food security, criminal justice and more recognize that all issues are interwoven or closely linked and we must work together to address complex issues.
